
### Beyond Me Project Sedona Charter School








## Makerspace










# Floor plan



## Budget

We have some possible floor plans which are a very important part of the budget.

We have to find a good plan for the layout to make sure we stay in a good price range.

A lot of other Rec Centers in Phoenix have a big budget to make a fun filled place and we want to make it even better than the ones there because there are not many activities for teens in a small town like Sedona

The average wage is around \$17 an hour for Rec Center employees. Depending on our Recreation center, we could have a \$15-16 per hour range for employees.

We would need to figure out how to get a good amount of workers without paying an excessive amount of money.

The pool would need a lot of funding involved along with the basketball court because they are the biggest and we need to make sure they are made perfectly.

We are looking at an average of \$3.50-\$19 per sq foot. With all this information our budget is \$2.5 million, but we have some ideas for grants.



## Financing and grants

We have 5 grants, that are mostly for health and wellness, Makerspace, and some for play space.

For the health and wellness grants

- 1. **Northern Arizona Community Health Grant**, the grant amount is for more than \$50,000 dollars and is for Government Entity, Indigenous Group, and Nonprofit organizations
- 2. The NPS Federal Lands to Parks This grant would provide us the land to build the rec center instead of money. It would be very beneficial because Sedona has a lot of federal land, and it would also be a lot less expensive for the city to use this grant instead of purchasing the land.
- 3. **State Tourism Grants**: \$510 million in direct awards to help states quickly invest in marketing, infrastructure, workforce and other projects to rejuvenate a peaceful retreat, business and international travel. Which would work for a recreational center.

## Financing and grants

- 4. **Competitive Grants**: \$240 million to help communities that have been hardest hit by challenges facing the travel, tourism, and outdoor recreation sectors to invest in infrastructure, workforce, or other projects to support the recovery of the industry and economic resilience of the community in the future.
- 5. **G.E. Powered by Nike**, the goal of the community of practice (CoP) is to test and pilot activities that increase access to sports for girls. Participating agencies receive \$20,000 to implement a gender equity project plus commit to participating in an NRPA-led CoP, which provides education and networking opportunities related to advancing gender equity in sport. In addition to increasing girls' participation in programs, the CoP also will collectively advance strategies to increase the representation of women coaches.
